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A Life-Changing Field Trip to The Perot Museum

The students who visited the Perot, ranging from kindergarteners to high schoolers, were shocked to discover that Dallas used to be underwater, imagining the giant prehistoric crocodile, *Deinosuchus riograndensis*, swimming through their neighborhoods. In the Dynamic Earth Hall, students touched tornadoes and dressed up in bow ties and blue blazers to deliver live weather

forecasts in front of a green screen.

Dallas City Leaders Attend Afterschool System Building Meeting

Dallas AfterSchool Network was honored to be invited by the Wallace Foundation to join a group of 50 other afterschool intermediaries for a meeting about afterschool system building.

The "Better Together" conference explored the strategies employed by such cities as Boston, New York, and Washington, D.C. to create city-wide systems to support quality afterschool programming. These strategies are detailed in the Wallace report "Lessons from Five Cities on Building Systems to Improve After-School, Summer School, and Other Out of School Programming."

The conference covered quality improvement systems such as DASN's Program Quality Initiative; funding streams to support quality programming; and the need for management information systems to enable data-driven decisions.
