The UNT-Denton Pathways for Future Teachers Program's primary goal is to advance educational equity by recruiting and preparing a teacher workforce that is more representative of the racial, ethnic, and social diversity of student populations in P-12 schools. We seek to assist students who identify as BIPOC, First Generation, or are from households whose incomes are below the federal poverty threshold and are students that have participated in a high school-based teacher education program and/or have indicated a desire to become a teacher.

In collaboration with identified High Schools, Districts, Regional Community Colleges, the Pathways for Future Teachers program is part of the team helping students interested in pursuing a BS to become a certified teacher. We do this through articulation agreements and in-school programming. It is also a way to help guide students and their families as they transition from high school to UNT by connecting to everything from admissions, to financial aid/scholarships and housing, such as the Education Learning Living Community. Once at UNT, a cohort system will help provide the support needed to navigate post-secondary life. Pathways is here to help guide students in the right direction at all of the points along the way, and into the teaching profession.
